


QUESTION 3 Do you think the budget for cycling infrastructure should increase, stay the same, or decrease and why?

Roslyn Cassells	Increase	This is part of my Urgent Climate Action Plan and cycling infrastructure should be automatically integrated into all city planning at the earliest stages.
		I also favour a Free Bike program where the city would supply 10,000 bikes throughout Surrey for our use.
		Transit must also better integrate cycling and cyclists with no exclusionary policies. We need free bike lockups at all transit hubs, Skytrain, West Coast Express etc. as well as showers & lockups in the workplace, at community centers, and so on. I propose incentives for organizations & businesses which provide these amenities to workers and the public.
		Transit should be free. The cost of implementing a fare structure equals fares collected, so no economic benefit to charging for transit. There would be significant social and ecological benefits to free transit and universal bike access!

I took the city to court in January to try to stop the road through the park, although I was unsuccessful. If elected I will move to halt construction and re-wild the park And save the children's playground at Hjorth Park Elementary!
