


CITY OF WHITE ROCK - 2018 MUNICIPAL ELECTION CANDIDATE SURVEY RESULTS



As a former volunteer with HUB Cycling I worked hard on the Surrey-White Rock Local Area Committee along with the 0-5-0 White Rock Bicycle Club and the Cross Canada Cycle Touring Society to get the City of Surrey to look at making routes safer for cyclists. Presently the staff at the City of Surrey are considering many of the ideas presented and even have worked to update a work schedule to create some changes sooner than later. However, invitations to the City of White Rock staff to work with our working group often went unanswered by staff. If elected I would help facilitate a better dialogue between the City of White Rock and the City of Surrey to make sure that people who ride bikes in White Rock are able to reach shopping, employment, education, and recreational places in South Surrey in a seamless bicycle network.
